Aptucxet Trading Post Museum, Bourne

The structure existing today is a replica erected on the original foundation which was archaeologically excavated in the 1920's, and is surrounded by 12 acres of recreational land. Aptucxet Trading Post may have the earliest remains of a Pilgrim building. The known facts present a fascinating story, not only of an antique building but also of Bourne's participation in 17th-century events.

Benjamin Nye Homestead & Museum, Sandwich

The Benjamin Nye Homestead & Museum was built in 1678. Benjamin Nye and his wife-to-be Katherine Tupper, migrated from England to Saugus, MA in 1635 on the ship Abigail. They were among the first settlers of Sandwich in 1637, and began a large family that spread out across America. Here you can learn about activities of the Nye Family Association and some interesting Cape Cod history.

Falmouth Museums on the Green, Falmouth

The Falmouth Museums on the Green contain a treasure trove of stories and artifacts that tell the story of the town of Falmouth, Massachusetts. The museums overlook the Village Green where members of the Colonial militia practiced in the 1700s and sea captains built their homes. Two 18th-century houses display period furniture, fine art, textiles and rotating exhibits that provide a glimpse into the town's rich historic past.
